

Waste and Recycling Collections. On 28 April 2025, the Council moved to a 3-weekly black bin collection and to a 5-day collection schedule which meant that residents in the Holywell area would no longer have Saturday collections. This meant that the waste and recycling collection routes and calendars needed to be changed for all of Flintshire.

There was a lot of resistance to this at the time. However, the changes appear to be having an impact with a significant reduction in the amount of residual waste in black bins being collected. However, the garden waste (brown bin) and recycling, and Absorbent Hygiene Product collections are a different story. It appears that there was an unexpected change in the Brown Bin Calendar that resulted in the wagons coming round to collect when residents did not expect them. The next week the wagons did not come when the residents were expecting them.

I had many reports of individual and groups of properties being missed for up to 6 weeks in some instances. I am still trying to find out why this happened to so many residents. I am told that some of them are due to 'Operational Issues' and some are due to incompatibility between three software systems that do not communicate with each other. The Officers and the IT Teams are working their way through these issues and hopefully everything will run smoothly eventually.

I have been advising residents to report missed collections (preferably) online or on the Streetscene Contact Centre on 01352 701234 (where you can expect a long wait to get through). Missed collections must only be made the next day. Reporting too early will result in the report being allocated to the previous collection date and is likely to be dismissed. When a missed collection is reported online, the system automatically sends you an email with two reference numbers as evidence that it has been logged. Please forward the email and attachment to me for my records and further action. This should be done each time there is a missed collection, particularly when there are repeated missed collections over several weeks. I have discovered, to my surprise and disappointment, that when successive missed collections are reported to the Streetscene Contact Centre the operator does not assign new reference numbers to each one. Instead, they use the same reference number and send an email to the local Supervisor. This has the effect of distorting the number of reported missed collections and therefore the performance appears better than it is. It is therefore very important that residents report every fully or partially missed collection online so that the number of reported missed collections more closely resembles the actual missed collections and the Officers will get a true indication of their service's performance. Whenever I speak to an Officer about missed collections the first thing they ask for are the reference numbers. They cannot do anything without these numbers. If your neighbours do not have internet access, please report it on their behalf.

The number of residents visiting the centres has fallen sharply since the Covid pandemic. The Councillors and Officers held a workshop to present the result of a public consultation and to explore service enhancements. In view of this the Council is proposing a 'peripatetic model', meaning staff would no longer be based full-time in one place but would run part-time sessions at the existing centres alongside 'pop-up' sessions in rural towns and villages.

I have proposed that Hafan Deg Community Centre be used for such a pop-up session monthly on Wednesdays at the same time as the popular Community Fridge events.

The **F7 Bus Service** was mentioned in the last edition. I had made enquiries to see if the bus service could be enhanced to double the number of buses serving Treuddyn by diverting the Mold – Leeswood - Llanfynydd - Hope route into Treuddyn. The Council's Transport Officers have been working with Bus Service Operators and Transport for Wales and have come up with what appears to be a better proposal - which is subject to final agreement. Their proposals extend the Mold – Nercwys – Treuddyn route to include Coed Talon – Pontybodkin - Leeswood. There would be eight return journeys on an hourly basis.

I am also advised that the Officers are looking to extend the Transport for Wales *Fflecsi* service to include the Treuddyn ward. The *Fflecsi* service allows residents to pre-book bus journeys and specify where they want to be picked up and dropped off.

Fflecsi currently operates in the Holywell area, as well as the Buckley area that includes Penyffordd, Broughton, Higher Kinnerton, Hope, Caergwrle, Abermorddu, and Cefn-y-Bedd. I cannot release details of the new timetables or service start dates just yet but will be pleased to do so when the new services, that will dramatically improve public transport connectivity to Treuddyn residents, are officially announced.

DEFIBRILLATORS IN TREUDDYN

There are two defibrillators in cabinets with keypads in Treuddyn village. They both have keypads.

A hand torch or mobile phone torch would be useful in the dark.

"I want the Code for the Defibrillator located at the Schools Entrance, Ffordd y Llan, Treuddyn, CH7 4LN"

Use the code to open the yellow cabinet and remove the AED holder. Instructions to use the defibrillator are inside the holder.

Please return and notify Clerk Carolyn Thomas on 07795 242693 that it has been used.

Please note that Treuddyn Community Council is currently developing proposals to install a defibrillator at Rhydtalog.

When a flashlight grows dim or quits working, do you just throw it away? Of course not. You change the batteries.



The school's vision is to create rich and stimulating learning environments that effectively engage pupils and purposefully support their skill development. Staff have planned all learning areas thoughtfully, offering a range of interesting and practical resources, including 'loose parts', which pupils use during role-play and when developing their thinking and creative skills. For example, the outdoor construction area includes real-life building materials such as pallets, crates, and a variety of recycled electrical items, including drills, wires, and cables. These resources effectively spark pupils' imagination and creativity, motivating them to thoughtfully plan and build structures, such as dens and houses, with careful attention to quality and detail.







What is the Community Fridge?

The Community Fridge aims to reduce food going to waste. It helps people to the planet. The food comes from businesses that cannot keep food that is 'use by' dates. Since April, the divert 3.97 tonnes of waste from



the amount of good quality eat well while also helping supermarkets and local past its 'best before' and community has helped landfill.

What food is available from the Community Fridge?

The selection varies, depending on availability. We don't know what we'll get each week, but it can include store cupboard ingredients like rice and stock cubes, as well as bread, fruit, vegetables, juice, meat, dairy produce and a few treats.

Who can visit the Community Fridge?

Anyone is welcome, no referrals are needed. We ask that only 1 person per household attends. Members are asked to bring a regular-sized carrier bag and we invite donations of $\mathfrak{L}3$ (or whatever they can afford).

The main source of food is FareShare, who distribute supermarkets' food to charities across the country. Donations will help to support the ongoing costs of accessing this food in 2026 and beyond.

We currently have 2 regular volunteers and would welcome new volunteers! Please call in speak to the Fridge Lead if you may be interested. The Community Fridge also welcomes donations of store cupboard items.
