a) Matters arising from the minutes

1. Members expressed their thanks to Mr Ian Williams FCC Streetscene for the work carried out on Ffordd-y-Felin – a good job was done re-routing the drainage and drainage on Mynydd Du / Black Mountain.

7. CCTV – QUEEN STREET PLAY AREA

The CCTV Security System Invitation to Tender – Treuddyn playing field, went out to three CCTV Installation companies in June 2022. The supplier to provide details of the CCTV Cameras and Control and Recording Equipment which would provide coverage of the playing field and the area surrounding the village hall. Only one of the companies could provide what was set out in the tender. A Quote came in from a local security company at £5350 + Vat for the installation of up to 8 cameras.

The cost for a steel cabinet and steel conduit = £1480.00

The time limit for the three quotes to be received was this evening 20/09/22

It was proposed by Cllr. C. Swan to accept the quote from the supplier as given above.

It was also noted that the TCA (Treuddyn Community Association) of the Village Hall are concerned who pays for the electric to run the recording equipment etc.

Treuddyn C.C would cover all costs.

It was agreed that Cllr. A. Marshall works with the company to the agreed spec of cameras and coverage required.

14. CORRESPONDENCE

1. Eisteddfod Gadeiriol Treuddyn – A letter from the committee thanking TCC for the generous grant towards the preparations to celebrate the Centenary of the Urdd.

Treuddyn became the first village in Wales to recruit 50 youngsters to form the first branch.

The celebrations include the new village road signs on entry to Treuddyn, the Adran Gyntaf (First Branch) will be noted on all the signs.

Arrangements are in place for the unveiling of the commemorative plinth in the corner of Queen Street car park on Friday, October 21st 2022 at 1pm. All members of the Community Council and the Clerk are extended a warm invitation to be present. The plinth will be unveiled by Myrddin ap Dafydd, Archdruid of Wales.

2. It was brought to the attention of TCC that the Pump Track had been used by Wrexham RC Go-Ride Club in which local children could not use the track on this specific day. It is a public track and the club understand they don't have exclusive use while there.

There had been a misunderstanding on this specific day and the club offer their sincere apologies for any inconvenience caused to the parent and child.

Over the last few years 2 to 3 sessions a year have been held at the track with out any issues, a few children from Treuddyn have joined in the sessions.

TCC have not been aware of such events taking place and would like to know the basis of where this started.

It would be good for the club to offer all local children free coaching to encourage them to do more with the group.

Another session has been planned for November 26th 2022.

The clerk also received an email from a Mr Williams Broster – Dragon Sport Officer. Mr Broster and Welsh Cycling will be running a cycling/bxm festival for primary schools on the pump track/field. The festival is going to run between 9am and 12pm on Friday 30th September 2022.

Also requesting access to the village hall for toilets and possible shelter for first aid assistant.

It was noted the more the pump track is used it would require extra maintenance. A member stated TCC could possibly ask for a donation towards future events.

The clerk to reply to the organisers.

3. Mega Electrical NW Ltd

Are now planning the Christmas lighting work. If there are any changes or additions to displays, to let the company know by the end of September.

It was agreed to install Christmas lights on the corner of Erw Llan. (Clerk to check the site)

For the street light decorations to be erected the first week of December.

4. Leeswood and Pontblyddyn Community Council. The Chairman Councillor G. Sherwood sends an invitation to his Civic Service to held at Leeswood Methodist Church on Sunday 30th October 2022 at 2.00pm

Followed by light refreshments at Leeswood Community Centre. RSVP by 14th October 2022.

5. Dragon Sport Holiday Club held through the Summer Holidays. Report for Treuddyn C.C

The holiday camp was delivered for five weeks at Treuddyn. Delivering two afternoon sessions per week from the 26th July to the 25th August.

- 117 attendances at the 10 sessions
- The average attendance at each session was 12, over a 5 week period
- A vast range of sports/activities were delivered

The program has been good for the young people to interact and keep active over the summer break. Dragon Sports thanked TCC for funding the program.

6. Wales Air Ambulance Charity – On behalf of the pilots, medical team and staff at Wales Air Ambulance. They thanked TCC for the donation of £400.27 raised by the Queens Jubilee Celebrations held in the village.

7. A letter of concern received Re: Traffic / Safety and difficulty crossing to the primary schools. This is an on going issue in front of the primary schools regarding the parking of vehicles during drop off and pick up times. The lack of visibility to cross the road safely due to cars parked on pavements and on the Junction near the ‘Old Farmers Arms’

Children running out of the staff car park towards the road.

Parking bays need to be painted in front of the ‘Farmers’ as originally requested this would help with some of the parking.

Cllr. B. Jones proposed we look at a Zebra crossing and possibly double yellow lines.

The clerk to write to Katie Wilby Chief Officer Streetscene and Transportation and Mr Anthony Stanford to re-arrange a site visit.
