4. CCTV QUEEN STREET PLAYING FIELD – TREUDDYN

Update on the consultation period and the Installation of the CCTV camera.

Information had been published on TCC Website and Treuddyn Community Face book page inviting comments from the community.

The Clerk reported there had been positive feedback in favour for the permanent installation of the CCTV camera. Several emails received by the clerk thanking TCC for the hard work that has gone into this project with a positive outcome (shared with members this evening)

No negative comments had been received.

Members were pleased with the response from the community the CCTV camera has been installed.

7. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

8. PLAY AREAS – Treuddyn & Coed-Talon

- Coed-Talon – The damaged fencing running alongside the bridleway has not been repaired. FCC Street scene have done a temporary repair. Secure fencing needs to be put up.
- Treuddyn – New signs for the BMX Track and the Small Wheels area are in the final stages of being completed.
- POD – There will be no changes made to the sides of the Pod.
- Damage to Muga fencing – this has been repaired by Flintshire Fabrications Ltd
- Small stone path leading onto Small Wheels area. A quotation received of £1,250.00 to concrete the path.

It was agreed to obtain another quote.

9. VILLAGE NOTICE BOARDS

Update on order.

Notice boards have been ordered for the following locations.

Delivery time is approximately seven weeks – delivery should be around the middle of October.

10. MONTHLY ACTION PLAN

Matters raised with FCC Streetscene were discussed and updated.

1. Nercwys Junction meeting the A5104 – Potholes have been infilled.
2. Llan Cottages – Broken kerb has been repaired.
3. Ffordd y Felin – Report of nasty potholes either end.
4. Request for pavement to be urgently cleaned back and swept from Beehive cottage to the Llanfynydd Junction.

Cllr. A. Marshall had a drive around with Mr Ian Williams FCC Streetscene Area Supervisor noting areas that require attention e.g. Blocked ditches, potholes and general highway issues.

Cllr. A. Marshall also informed members that roads and potholes that require attention can also be reported on 'Stan the App' (safer travel around neighbourhoods) Issues can be recorded on your phone and put onto the App.

Issues are put on a traffic light system, Flintshire C.C can also access the app. The app also gives you access to see what is happening to roads in the country.

11. TREUDDYN CEMETERY

- a) Update from the working party during the Summer recess re: clearing of vegetation. Three sessions were held through the Summer clearing a lot of vegetation, it is looking a lot better. It was agreed another session would be good before the winter.
- b) Weedkiller would tidy the area as you go through the small gate and around the entrance.

Ash tree

The tree inspector has had another look at the Ash tree by the gate, sadly it is suffering with die back. Given its location and possible impact if it were to fall FCC have decided to take it down. A date has not been given as other Ash trees need to be taken down in Buckley Cemetery.

It has been requested when FCC take the tree down if they can leave the bottom of the tree the same height as the hedge otherwise a massive hole will be left.

12. CORRESPONDENCE

1. Ysgol Parc y Llan – Letter from the Headteacher Re: Breakfast Club. The contents of the letter was discussed, members had questions they would like to put forward before consideration is given to the request.

It was agreed to invite the Headteacher to the October meeting.

2. Fit, Fed & Read – Aura Summer Provision / Treuddyn

Five sessions were held over the Summer holidays at Treuddyn play area with 530 people attending. The sessions were very popular and enjoyed by the families.

3. A letter from a resident who has just moved to the area sent to Cllr. A. Marshall.

Concerns as you turn into Maes Glas – the junction where you need to stop and look both ways there are cars always parked on the junction making visibility of oncoming traffic difficult. Also, vehicles coming into Maes Glas and turning around in Glasdir – a sign stating ‘No through Road’ would be helpful.

The signage for ‘Glasdir’ has worn away and is not very clear.

Cllr. A. Marshall is addressing the matters raised.

Action: The Clerk to contact the PCSO’s who cover our area to walk around the village taking note of matters that have been raised by TCC and residents.

4. Letter from Wrexham CC Go-Ride asking TCC’s permission to use the BMX Track for coaching on the 5th October – usual notices and social media awareness. ***Permission given.***

6. FCC – Two training sessions for Town and Community Councillors have been planned and will be held virtually on Tuesday 22nd and Thursday 24th October at 6pm

Councillors only attend one of the dates of preference.

The training will be aimed at both new and existing councillors and will cover The Code of Conduct.

The training will be held virtually via Zoom.

The Clerk to send the training dates out to members.

7. Standards Committee – Joint meeting with Town and Community Councils Monday 4th November. The meeting will be held virtually via Zoom.

There will be a 30-minute training session beforehand which will commence at 6pm. The meeting will follow immediately afterwards and will last approximately 2 hours ending at 8.30pm.

The topic for the training will be “When is a prejudicial interest not a prejudicial interest?” It will focus on the important exemptions within the code that prevent a personal interest becoming a personal and prejudicial interest.

17. COMMUNITY COUNCILLORS REPORTS

1. War Memorial – Cllr. C. Metcalf to plant up flower boxes.

2. Stream off the A5104 near the Gilrhos Junction. Report of stream being white in colour. It was stated a water mains pipe had broken and flowing into the stream. The waterboard are working to fix the pipe.

3. Cllr. B. Jones expressed his thoughts regarding the danger of cars parked on pavements and Junctions. It was a couple of years back that TCC had a FCC representative Mr Anthony Stanford who attended a meeting to discuss a plan drawn up to try and resolve the parking issues near the school.

Cllr. B. Jones stated “I would like to see TCC make progress regarding road safety and parking in the community.

AM “There hasn’t been any accidents in the last 10 plus years. There are issues down Ffordd Top y Rhos as large vehicles can’t be taken through, and pavements can’t be narrowed. It is quite an issue as there doesn’t seem anything that can be done.

I will be meeting with Mr Lee Shone FCC Highways to discuss matters in the area”.

4. Top up of salt bins and salt piles. To include Ffordd y Felin as there was no salt delivered last winter.

5. Ffordd y Gilrhos Junction coming onto the A5104 - overgrown hedge effecting visibility.

The property has been empty for a long time and has just been sold.

6. Corner of Queen Street onto Ffordd y Gilrhos – property on left hand side, hedge requires cutting back.
