9. PLAY AREAS

Coed-Talon – There were no issues reported.

Treuddyn – ‘Small Wheel Play - The Clerk to confirm with Bendcrete when work will start on the build.

The new Keep Fitness apparatus quote for design option 1 received from Proludic through Mr Richard Roberts Aura Leisure Services was coming in at £20,000. It was also advised that planning permission would possibly be required due to where the apparatus would be sited.

10. MONTHLY ACTION PLAN

Matters raised with FCC Streetscene were discussed and updated.

1. Ffordd-y-Rhos – Trees in front of Pensioners bungalows. The height of the trees are causing a lot of shading over the bungalows and the tree roots have lifted the pavement causing a trip hazard.

Cllr. A. Marshall stated that Mr D. Ellis FCC Tree Inspector has had a look at the trees and they belong to housing.

A member put forward the trees should be taken down and replant new trees to replace.

11. CORRESPONDENCE

1. Aura Leisure & Libraries – An invoice received for the Fit, Fed & Read 2024 that will take place on Treuddyn playing field during the Summer holidays.

Note: Members agreed the invoice will not be paid until the services have been delivered.

2. A message received via TCC website from a resident who lives on Ffordd y Blaenau bringing to the Council's attention a large potted area at the top of Ffordd y Blaenau in between Chapel House and Talwrn Glas. The issue has been reported by the resident to FCC Streetscene in June 2023 and still nothing has been done. The potholes have caused damage to vehicles.

Action:

The Clerk to inform Mr Ian Williams FCC Streetscene the urgency to get the potholes infilled.

3. Consultation on Reviewing the Council Tax Premiums Scheme for long term empty properties and second homes in Flintshire.
