Draft Minutes of the Meeting held Wednesday 19th April, 2022 at Hafan Deg for 7.00pm

4. **MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC**

Two members of the public present.

Mr R. Fleming to discuss and finalise arrangements re: celebrating the ‘Queens Platinum Jubilee’
The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited Mr Fleming to give an update.

“ There will be at least six volunteers on the day. We are using the village hall marquee and two medium sized gazebos.

Marquee – 6 x 18 metres

2 x gazebos – 3 x 6 metres

The Ice cream van is booked.

There will be a coconut shy; I have also bought wood to make a target for sponge throwing. I have acquired safety fencing to go around the generators, 10 interlocking pieces in yellow.

The entertainers will be supplying their own fuel for the generator, regarding the Bouncy Castles once the fuel runs out TCC will need to top up with fuel and pay.

Bulldog Hire supplies the Bouncy Castles, there will be a pillar bash and a Jungle assault course, total cost £430.

There will be live entertainment, singing and entertainment for the children.

Cost: Generators and fuel = £195.00 Staging and backdrop = £325.00 Live Duo Entertainment = £450.00

Total = £970.00

Face Painting: Total cost = £200 Children will have their faces painted for free.

I would like to purchase 100 helium balloons, weights and ribbons”

Balloons – Members voted against the purchase of Helium balloons; the concern of balloons landing in livestock fields and also harm to small wild animals.

There will be a 50p charge for the coconut shy and 50p charge for wet sponge throwing – It was agreed the proceeds go to a nominated charity.

There will be prizes for children in fancy dress.

Raffle prize donations would be greatly appreciated.

It would be useful to have 2 extra litterbins on the field. The clerk to ask the local PCSO’s to attend.

Cllr. G. Short has kindly offered to put a poster together to advertise the event. Twenty-five posters to be printed off to advertise in the village and Schools - Cllr. C. Metcalf will also put the event onto the village social media site.

The Chair and members thanked Mr Fleming for all his hard work putting the event together and look forward to attending the Jubilee Event.

The Clerk will keep in contact with Mr Fleming regarding Invoices etc.

The Chair invited the second gentleman to speak.

“ I have lived in the village for 40 years or so and the cost of our Council Tax is going up every year, we are getting less and less for the money we pay. We pay for our Brown Bins and now FCC has introduced a number of restrictions to visit the local recycling centres. The number of regulations they have put in place will see people turn to fly tipping, costing FCC more money to clean up the mess.

Labour has run the Welsh Assembly for the last twenty years; they inherited a good set up. I drive 30,000 miles a year; we've got poor roads.

Legislation has also come in to give extra space for cyclists, horse riders etc. which is fine.

The road surfacing that was carried out on the A5104 from Coed-Talon to the Llanfynydd Junction, trees were to be cut back – what trees? and only half a job was done tarmac the road.

Flintshire County Council should open the market to contractors who can do the job”.

The Chair and members stated that services' is costing FCC more and we are getting less for the council tax we pay.

The restrictions that has been put in place for the Recycling Centres in Flintshire is a concern.

5. MR ANTHONY STANFORD FCC TRANSPORT MANAGER

Mr Stanford was to attend TCC meeting this evening. The clerk spoke to Mr Stanford and the following was discussed.

Mr Stanford has previously met with TCC to discuss a number of potential options and associated processes and legislation on Ffordd -y- Llan near the school campus.

Mr Stanford believes it is more beneficial to meet members on site in order to view the ongoing difficulties that are being experienced. This will provide an opportunity to view the issues and how to best move forward on this.

The available dates put forward by Mr Stanford w/b 9th May were not suitable for members.

The Clerk to put forward Tuesday 17th May for 2.30pm.
