Streetscene. On 24 April 2026 I spent a couple of hours with the Streetscene Area Co-ordinator. We were at Well Street, Ffordd Top y Rhos, Ffordd yr Odyn, Black Mountain, Ffordd y Blaenau, and Ffordd Cae Hic.

Flintshire is split into 8 Streetscene Areas. We are in Area 8, which also includes Llanfynydd, Leeswood, Penyffordd, Higher Kinnerton, Hope, and Caergwrle wards.

FCC has only one Pothole Pro that was provided by Welsh Government Grant Funding of around £125,000. It is in use somewhere every day, excepting maintenance periods. Currently, the Pothole Pro is allocated to each Area for one day only and returns every two weeks. It must travel out to site and return to Alltami Depot every day. This is time consuming and expensive and there is not enough time in the day to do many repairs on the 738 miles of roads in Flintshire.

There are plans to allocate the Pothole Pro to each area for a full week every 8 weeks and this should allow more effective use of it in the County. There is a need for an additional Pothole Pro so that they could cover the North and South of the County and each Area could be served every 4 weeks. This would require a capital investment by the Council or a Welsh Government Grant.

The Council has been concentrating Highway Repairs starting with Area 1 (North Flintshire), then 2, 3, etc. It is now Area 8's turn so you will be seeing a lot more activity (with road closures, traffic lights, etc) in this area in the near future.

You will have noticed that there has been a lot of activity in Pontblyddyn and Llong in the past few weeks. These repair works have been reported many months ago by the Area Co-ordinator and the previous late Cllr Ray Hughes and it has taken a lot of time to plan the works and award Contracts, etc. Some might get the wrong impression that it is the newly elected Leeswood Councillor that has got these works done quickly. I have investigated this and have it on good authority that it is not the case.

I have had complaints about the deep potholes and long ruts along Ffordd Cae Hic to Llanfynydd. For the past week another pothole planing machine 'The Bobcat' has been working there and has brought the surface to a good condition again.

I have suggested that Ffordd Nercwys be closed for a period to allow the 3 very long sections of multiple pothole repairs to be done properly in one operation.

We visited Ffordd Top y Rhos where a video was posted on Facebook. The repairs shown in the video are temporary to fill the holes. They are not permanent. I agree that a change in method to increase the life of the repair needs to be undertaken.

We went round Ffordd yr Odyn and Black Mountain and saw some very large potholes, blocked gullies and culverts. A lot of work is needed here and that has been registered and I understand it is being worked on.

Ffordd Top y Rhos, past Plas ym Mhowys has blocked culverts and gullies and needs repairing. Terrig Hill and Ffordd y Felin hill are the same.

I was also told that Streetscene have introduced a new defect reporting system to replace the current system which requires a lot of personal intervention. The Area Co ordinator can enter a defect on a tablet, whilst doing their inspection tours, and it will appear on the repair team's tablet shortly afterwards. This means that if the repair team are in a nearby area they could go to the site and repair it the same day.

The Llanfynydd Road Traffic Lights have now been replaced following many years of complaints from residents from all affected wards, Community and County Councillors and others. I am told that the Contract for replacing traffic lights across all of North Wales was signed around 4 years ago and it has taken that long to implement the change. I'm sure you will agree that the performance has improved considerably.



Waste and Recycling Collections. On 28 April 2025, the Council moved to a 3-weekly black bin collection schedule. There was a lot of resistance to this at the time. However, the changes appear to be having an impact with a significant reduction in the amount of residual waste in black bins being collected and consequently has removed a potential £540,000 Welsh Government infraction charge (fine) for failing to meet its recycling targets. This money was allocated to the Council's

Risk Reserves and will be transferred to Non-allocated Reserves in case it is needed by any of the Council's portfolios.

The number of complaints I get about missed recycling, black and food bin collections has reduced significantly, which is good news. I know there may be instances of random missed collections. These need to be reported to Streetscene so that they are recorded in the performance reporting system.

However, changes to the Garden Waste (brown bin) system whereby Yellow self adhesive labels are being issued to identify bins that have been paid for has experienced some issues. Residents paying online have not received their labels in good time and have had to chase up Streetscene to get the labels. This defect is currently being investigated. Due to the time to process the payments and send out the labels, it may be necessary to pay in January in future.

This year the service has been extended to include monthly winter collections in December, January, and February. Collection dates are yet to be announced.

The F7 Bus Service. Following the authorised, but premature, announcement in the last edition, the residents of the Mold to Hope leg of this service objected to the changes due to their not being consulted about what would cancel their only bus service. I was then advised a full consultation was to be undertaken.

On 18 April 2026 I attended a public meeting in Llanfynydd that was attended by residents of Llanfynydd, Ffrith, and Cymau who were concerned about the potential loss of their F7 bus service. Two members of the FCC Transport Team were there to give a presentation on what was happening.

Some statistics were provided about the number of journeys per village. The figures for those three villages are about 5% whilst Treuddyn is 61%. However, that does not consider the percentage of the population of each village that use the bus service. I have asked for those to be provided.

Some time was given to describing how the Fflecsi service works. This is available in Holywell area, and Buckley, Penyffordd, Caergwrle, and Hope. It is planned to be extended to Treuddyn, Leeswood and Llanfynydd wards.

The medical appointment service was also described and is available now.

A consultation is planned soon, and I have asked for all villages along both sections of the F7 routes (Mold to Treuddyn, and Mold to Hope via Leeswood and Llanfynydd) to be included in the consultation.

I was unaware that prior to COVID that the LT7 used to run from Mold through Treuddyn and Llanfynydd to Hope, excluding Leeswood. Leeswood was added during COVID, and I understand that the service should have been restored post-COVID - but was not. Any feedback on how the service operated then would be welcome.

I made a point that including Treuddyn in the route between Mold and Hope would provide connections with the Bidston railway line at Cefn y Bedd and Caergwrle stations that would open up travel to Liverpool, West Coast Mainline at Shotton, Wrexham and stations beyond. Additional bus connections would also be available. Is this something Treuddyn residents would like to have again? If so, please let me know.

I am proposing that a Public Meeting be held in Hafan Deg with the Transport Officers in attendance as part of the consultation process. Until the consultation is conducted and analysed, etc, the F7 bus will continue as it is now.

Speeding traffic. I have had numerous complaints about speeding traffic along the long straight stretch of Ffordd y Rhos (that has no footpath), with calls for traffic calming measures (such as speed bumps) to be implemented. I have passed these complaints onto the Streetscene Highways and Traffic Officer and they, in conjunction with North Wales Police and Arrive Alive, speed data gathering surveys are being undertaken. You might also have noticed the Arrive Alive Speed Camera Vans being located on Ffordd y Rhos.

Condition of Stiles on Public Footpaths.

A resident recently told me that the stiles on some Public Footpaths in the ward are in poor condition. I investigated further and found some four of the five stiles on one footpath are in a dilapidated and unsafe condition. I have reported these to the Council Footpaths Team and was provided with a link to a useful map that includes location and condition details of all footpaths, stiles, gates, signposts in Flintshire. If anyone knows of any other defective stiles or gates please take a photo and send it by email or WhatsApp to me so I can investigate it further and report it. Otherwise just call me to report it.

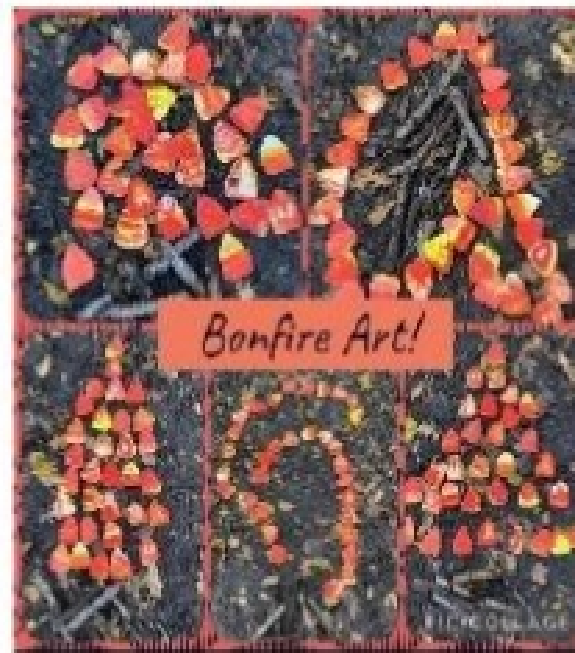

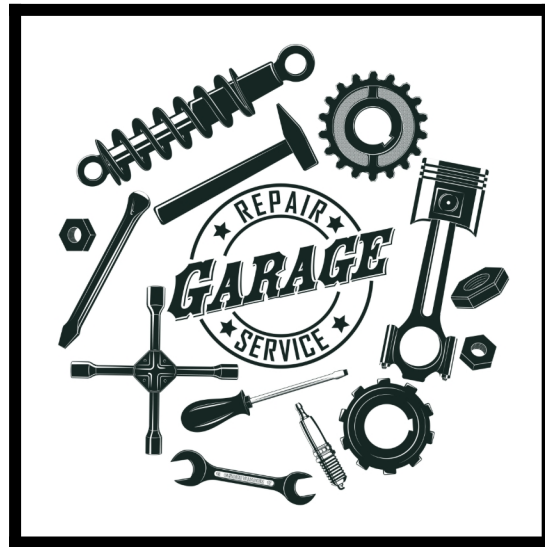

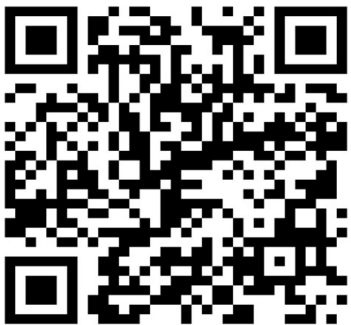
