Minutes of the Meeting held Tuesday 18th April, 2023 at Hafan Deg Community Centre Treuddyn for 7.00pm

1. APOLOGIES : Cllrs. C. Metcalf, D. Roberts & G. Short PUBLIC SESSION 6.50pm to 7.00pm

One member of the public present.

The Chair welcomed the member of the public to the meeting and invited Mrs Jones to speak.

"I have come along this evening to raise concern about the bus service from the village, we have four buses a day (LT7A) and we can't really afford to have any less buses. We don't have a direct bus to Wrexham – we have to go to Mold Bus Station. The LT7 departs from Mold to Leeswood and Llanfynydd and a change over in Caergwrle on another bus to Wrexham.

I have to leave at 8.30am for a 1.45pm hospital appointment in Wrexham.

It would be ideal if the No.27 Arriva Wrexham bus could divert to Treuddyn a couple of times a week. There is a community service bus you pay for, but can't always wait for you depending how long your appointment is.

We are being encouraged to move away from our vehicles and use public transport, how can we do this when you live in a rural area with hardly any bus services and no cycle routes.

It would be good if we could have some public transport to Wrexham".

Members took on board what was said. Cllr. A. Marshall would go back to County Hall and put forward what has been discussed.

The Chair and members thanked Mrs Jones for attending this evening.

It was stated that majority of people like a hard copy of the booklet to hand.

Item 17 - Moving of Bus Shelter on Ffordd-y-Rhos

The Clerk received the following feedback from Cllr. G. Short.

Cllr. G. Short would be strongly against this proposal. The bus stop in its current location is used by the school

children attending both High Schools. If the vacant plot behind is developed the developer would have to

incorporate the shelter as an existing feature on the road verge.

Moving the shelter would also incur unnecessary costs for TCC. Consultation would need to be made with the adjacent properties as they were consulted with the original siting of the shelter. The shelter would impinge on the properties next to the Post Box.

Cllr. C. Swan commented, the railings are not the boundary and the owner knows this. He has also ripped the hedge out exposing the bus shelter to the prevailing wind and rain. The clerk had sent photographs to FCC planning department months ago but no reply has been received.

Item 17 – Resurfacing of the A5104 – No date has been confirmed when work will start.

All are welcome at our services each Sunday at 9:30 details of which are at the entrances to the Churchyard.





A Tribute to Ben

Martin and I, and all our family would like to thank everyone for your kindness and support following the sad loss of our son, Ben, it has meant so much to us.

Ben was kind, caring, thoughtful, talented, determined, adventurous and courageous. He was fearless and inspired others to reach their potential and be the best possible person. He sought the best in everyone and enjoyed helping people. Ben attended Ysgol Parc y Llan in Treuddyn and Castell Alun High school in Hope. He was an accomplished trombone player, working through the grades at school and with the County music service, to grade 8 trombone, he performed in many bands, including Skariad (see photo outside the Cavern Club in Liverpool where they performed one evening), he made great friends and taught himself to play the piano.

He worked out to an incredible level of fitness, running marathons, cycling and climbing up mountains, swimming outdoors, and he broke the gym record on a treadmill despite an ankle injury.

He was adventurous and enjoyed being outdoors surrounded by nature, be it woodland, mountains or sea. He was always prepared with kit and he educated and trained himself as well as taking part in courses.

He worked his way through the Duke of Edinburgh awards to Gold and became a Duke of Edinburgh young leader helping with expeditions.

Ben was very creative and excelled in art, design technology, maths and science. He developed his engineering and science skills and went on to do an engineering degree with Raytheon. He won an award with them for designing a 3d printing hub.

Ben was interested in the Cosmos and space travel, physics and science, renewable technology, and the natural world. He had been trying to join the Navy, at a higher level for the last 6 years. At 18 years of age he hoped to join as an officer but was told to get more experience in life, perhaps go to University. That is when he started his degree in mechanical engineering with Raytheon, but he always thought he had more to achieve, to learn and to give. Following years of interviews, tests and applications, Ben was offered a coveted accelerated apprenticeship in aeronautical engineering with the Royal Navy, starting as a Leading Hand. (We were told later by our Navy liaison officer that it took him 5 years to reach this level). Ben achieved more than most in his life, he was extraordinary and created ripples, we hope now that people will continue to carry his light and love.

As this is the first newsletter since standing down as Treuddyn County Councillor and becoming a North Wales ,regional member of the Senedd I thought it might be helpful to say a little about the role.

I usually travel to Cardiff each week, by train, to speak in the chamber on debates and ask questions to Welsh Government Ministers on issues raised with me by constituents and organisations; as there are 60 members of the Senedd, compared to 650 MPs, my name does get drawn from the ballot box frequently, so if you have any questions or issues you would like me to raise on you behalf please let me know. We also sit on committees which do detailed investigations and reports to feed into Government decisions and policies. I am a member of the Local Government and Housing committee, as well as the Culture, Communications, Welsh Language, International Relations and Sports Committee.

Mondays are spent meeting people locally, online or in person, responding to emails, doing research and travelling to Cardiff.

Tuesdays and Wednesdays start early with meetings, committees, cross party groups and end with plenary which starts at 1.30 pm and finishes any time between 6.00 pm and 8.00 pm, depending when the vote is. The cross party groups as well as committees are a good way of hearing from experts representing charities, business and the public sector about issues, they also visit the Senedd to speak to us regarding policies and funding. I Chair a cross party group on Public Transport and another on Animal Welfare. I am also working on a project on behalf of the Minister for Climate Change regarding managing grass verges and amenity grass for nature and biodiversity, and am a member of the North Wales Wildlife Trust.

I have met with nurses from North Wales visiting Cardiff who were concerned regarding wages and working hours, it was organised by the Royal College of Nursing; and also the British Heart Foundation and Cancer Research UK who are concerned regarding cuts to University research funding now that we have left the European Union. I have also been on the picket line with Royal Mail employees, as a former postwoman, I have seen how the working conditions have been eroded over recent years.

Fridays and weekends are days in North Wales where I attend events and meetings in person anywhere across the region from Wrexham to Anglesey. It covers a wide area of 6 Counties, part of Snowdonia National Park and as far as Pen-y-groes towards the Llyn Peninsula. Over the last two weeks, I visited Toyota and learned about how they are becoming sustainable, for example, all the cut offs of aluminium and steel are collected and reused, water is recycled and a waste recycling facility will

be built next door which will create electricity from anaerobic digestion, which will directly power the Toyota plant. They also had a question for me to take back to the Minister for Economy regarding tariffs which I followed up this week on my return to Cardiff. I visited Glyndwr University's facility at Northop campus learning about hydroponics, where they are growing plants vertically, in water, the Woodland Skills centre near Denbigh and community allotments and gardens in Flintshire. There is currently a lot of desire and need for returning to growing quality food sustainably, locally and ensuring food security. I also visited some businesses that are part of the Clwydian Range tourism group and have some questions and issues to raise on their behalf.

Locally, I have helped clear a footpath with the Ramblers and volunteers and visited schools to talk about recycling, nature conservation and my role as a member of the S When I am not busy with official engagements, I catch up with family and make the most of being back in our beautiful countryside walking my dogs. Recess of meetings in Cardiff is usually when there are schools holidays so that is another opportunity for catching up in the region and work from home. Train journeys are long but I take a flask, sandwiches and utilise the time reading committee papers and writing debates and questions. The train service is mostly good and reliable. One time I was talking to a couple who were travelling from Cardiff to Cwmbran, I noticed he had a prostate cancer badge on and he raised a health issue with me which I was able to follow up on his behalf. I have been lobbying for Wales to have its proportionate funding of £5bn from the UK Government's HS2 project, £1bn from the Northern Powerhouse project as well as Levelling Up funding which has

been rejected twice by the UK Government to improve the Wrexham to Bidston line. With the funding, Wales could have the much needed investment for rail infrastructure and it would free up rail funding which could be re-invested in the public bus transport network.

I continue to fight for public service funding at every level. Over 90% of the Welsh Government's budget is spent on public services, any extra money is swallowed up by rising inflation, and after a decade of austerity, all services are stretched. However, despite funding cuts, the Welsh Government has committed to investing in a new medical school as well as a dental academy at Bangor. There are new allied health training places for nurses, paramedics and other health practitioners at Glyndwr University, Wrexham. In Wales, bursaries are still available for nurses. I am currently working on a broadband project which I hope will be rolled out across North Wales. Last year I successfully lobbied for an extra £20m capital to be put into highway maintenance across Wales using underspend, and last week spoke in the Chamber about the need for further investment in our locally maintained network or roads, pavements and bridges.

I recently Chaired a meeting regarding public bus transport and am very concerned about the sustainability going forward as passengers have not returned, especially those with concessionary passes. No rail or bus journey is self-sustainable they all rely on public funding which is being squeezed.




