3. To approve the minutes of the meeting – 18th November 2025

4. To report on any matters arising from the minutes.

Item 6 - K6 Telephone Box.

It was noted if the telephone box is sold by the council the funds would be used on a project in the village - possibly extra Christmas lights.

It was agreed to see what suggestions the public put forward.

Item 8 – Treuddyn play area – Toddler playhouse table set on fire.

A picture of the responsible youths at the scene was put up on the Treuddyn Community Facebook page but was taken down quite quickly. The clerk made enquiries with one of the Community Facebook page administrators if they could help, unfortunately no information could be found. The administrator was thanked for their time looking into this.

Item 13 – Cllr. V. Speed thanked Cllrs. C. Swan & E. Swan for putting the tree up.

5. To discuss new projects in preparation for the precept 2026/2027

The following projects were put forward; costs would be discussed in the January meeting.

1. Christmas lights in the villages.
2. Treuddyn play area – A Climbing Spiders Web to replace the wooden jungle climber.
3. Coed-Talon play area – Fence upgrade to replace damaged fencing on the boundary of the bridleway.
4. Defibrillator – Rhydtalog - Cost of installation.

6. Planning

Planning Application ref: FUL/001002/25

Proposal: Extension to front porch, single storey rear extension with addition of a dormer to the east elevation. Erection of a new retaining wall.

Location: Pant Terfyn, Nercwys, Mold, CH7 4BW

Treuddyn C.C comments. No Objection

Planning Application ref: FUL/001005/25

Proposal: Retrospective application – change of use of dwelling/house to holiday let, new vehicle access from road.

Location: Ty Newydd, Ffordd Nerwys, Treuddyn, Mold, CH7 4BG

Councillors had no comments to put forward to the planning officer.

7. Play Areas – Treuddyn & Coed-Talon

The matchfunding for 2025/2026 was discussed for Treuddyn play area.

The following items as agreed in previous minutes will be installed in the Toddler area.

1. Playhouse – Cost £2,660.64 plus Installation £500 approximately = £3,160.64
2. Ladybird Springer – Cost £1,037.76 plus Installation £650 approximately = £1,687.76

Total = £4,848.40

TCC have ringfenced £5000 for play areas. The new items will be matchfunded £ for £ by Flintshire C.C in partnership with Gwella the approximate cost to TCC = £2,424.20.

The remaining £2,575.80 will be ringfenced for play areas towards the purchase of new play items.

8. Monthly Action Plan

Matters raised with FCC Streetscene – discussed and updated.

1. Ffordd-yr-Odyn intersection meeting Ffordd Mynydd Du – It has been reported that water is spouting out of the road but eases when rainfall has slowed down.

Cllr. A Marshall stated that there may be a possible blockage in the pipe. Investigational work needs to be carried out by FCC Streetscene.

2. Potholes – FCC Streetscene are doing their best to repair potholes in the county. Limited staff and resources are not helping.

Cllr. A. Marshall commented that no response is being received from FCC Streetscene. The repair list was read to members, Cllr. Marshall would like to see tickets of work.

9. Correspondence

1. A letter from a Coed-Talon resident nominating Coed-Talon to receive Christmas lights in the future. Also, the state of the road in Rhyd Osber, numerous messages have been sent to FCC by the resident but no action has been taken.

2. Speeding traffic along Ffordd-y-Rhos. Letter received from a resident which has been shared with councillors.

The letter was discussed.

It was noted the speed watch team is short of members, at least three people are required when out and about monitoring the speed of the traffic.

Anyone wishing to join the team must be vetted by North Wales Police. Applications are sent to Mr John Morris (94083) Community Speed Watch Manager North Wales Police.

Cllr. Eva Bech to speak to the resident.

Mr Lee Shone FCC Highway Officer will be contacted if speed strips could be put across the road, Mr Shone will also be asked if could contact the resident.

10. Street Lighting

No faults reported.

Christmas Lights – It has been brought to the council's attention that a Christmas festoon is quite bright shining into a property, the resident is elderly.

It was propose the festoon is switched off at 8.30pm.
 The chair asked for a vote on the proposal.
 All in favour – carried.
 The clerk to contact the electrical company to change the timing.

11. To approve invoices for payment and presentation of quarterly review of finances.

Expenditure was discussed to the end of the financial year 31/03/26 the approximate balance carrying over to 2026/2027 is £15,074.16
 Expenditure, projects etc will be discussed in the January meeting in preparation for the 2026/2027 precept.

It was put forward if FCC could move the sign to a different spot to provide maximum visibility.
